School Photos

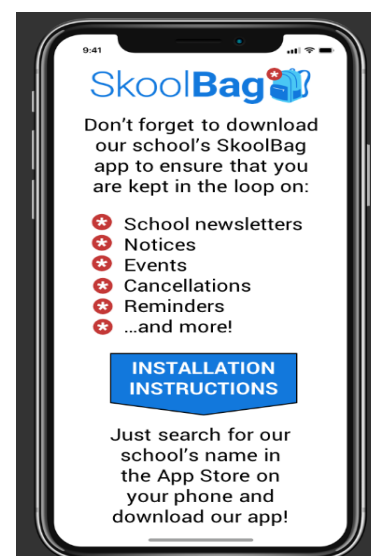

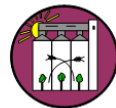

We believe that student effort is equally important something that should be discussed and celebrated with your child.
