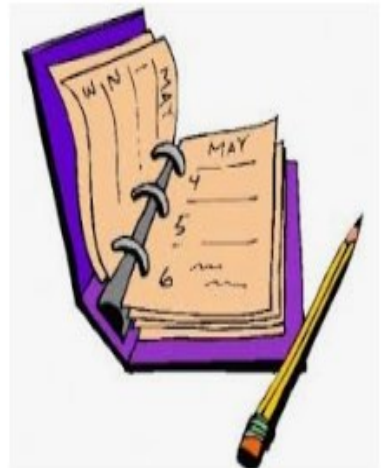
Did you know?

Research shows that one of the most important things you can do to increase a child's vocabulary is to explicitly teach them new words

Across the school, we define vocabulary as understanding the words that we hear, read, speak and write.

At RPS we do this through using the Three Tiers of Words framework.

<b>Tier 3 Words</b>	These words are subject specific : <i>sedimentary, continent, magma, molecule</i>
<b>Tier 2 Words</b>	These words that we see when we are reading A knowledge of tier 2 words is important for reading comprehension These words can also be used in formal conversations Tier 2 words can have multiple meanings: <i>masterpiece, measure, fortunate</i>
<b>Tier 1 Words</b>	These are the basic words that we use in everyday speech These words do not have multiple meanings. They are sight words, nouns, verbs and early reading words: <i>book, girl, sad, run, dog</i>

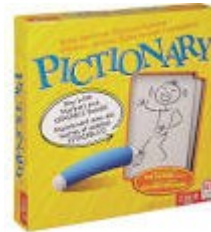
There are lots of things you can do at home to extend your child's vocabulary development:

When reading with your child point out some Tier 2 words.

Have a 'Word of the Week'. This could be something related to your family or a family outing or event. This word could be stuck on the Fridge and a challenge could be set to use the word as many times as possible over the week

Some other games you can play at home to support your child's vocabulary building include

Boggle, Junior Scrabble, Pictionary and Headbanz.

## PRIMARY SCHOOLS MUSIC FESTIVAL

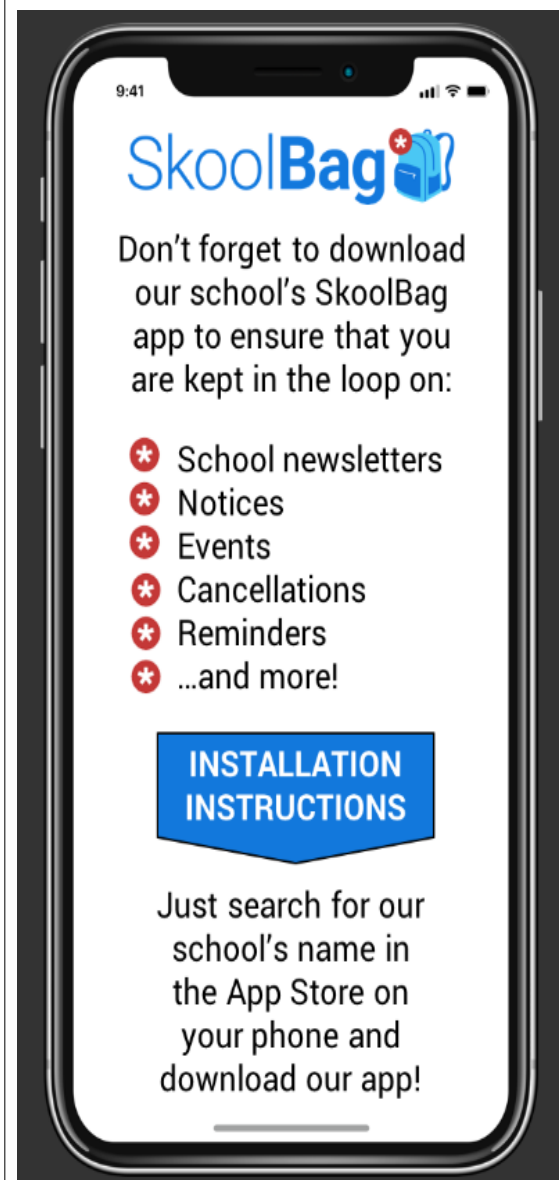
The Festival of Music is a school based music education program brought to you by the SA Public Primary Schools' Music Society and the Department for Education.
